

### Pupil Premium Progress 2013-14

For the financial year 2014-15 we received £23,900 of pupil premium funding. This is used to provide extended hours tuition (before or after school 1:1 or small groups); 1:1 or small group intervention by TAs or Teachers; to provide curriculum opportunities; reduce class sizes, provide to provide musical instrument tuition and resources.

The school closely monitors the progress of all children including those who are Pupil Premium. Due to the small numbers involved we will not publish additional information relating to the data below. Progress is tracked throughout the school year.
