Topic: Traditional Tales

This half term for our topic, we will focus on traditional tales in order to address a variety of different interests within our class. We will cover a different story each week and carry out a range of activities linked to each story that support the Early Learning Goals.

Maths: Where possible, this will be linked to our traditional tales.

Through provision and adult-led inputs we will cover several areas, including: measuring, counting and estimating, problem solving and time. We will also continue to consolidate previous learning around number recognition, adding, and finding one more and one less than a given number.

Literacy: We will continue our daily RWI phonics sessions and will begin to learn the Set 2 sounds (ay, ee, igh, ow, oo, oo, or, ar, ir, ou, oy). As part of our topic we will share different versions of traditional tales and as a class will make story maps to help us to sequence and retell familiar stories. We will also complete writing activities linked to our topic, such as making a 'Get well' card for Granny and writing instructions for making porridge for the Three Bears.
