# Leopards' Curriculum Newsletter

Our topic for this half-term will be 'What do Christians and Muslims believe?' As well as this, we will be busy preparing for the summer play and the Year 6s will begin their transition to high school.

## **Topic**

Our topic for this half-term is 'What do Christians and Muslims believe?' During this topic we will cover key beliefs and key figures of each religion. We will learn about their holy books and how they worship. Also, we will learn about key religious festivals and the stories behind these.

### <u>PSHE</u>

During PSHE lessons this half term, children will be learning about drugs and their effects on the body. They will learn about what drugs are legal and the negative effects of tobacco and alcohol. They will learn about how peer pressure can affect people and strategies to deal with this. Year 6 children will also learn about illegal drugs.

### Maths

For maths lessons this half-term, Year 5 children will begin learning some of content required in Year 6 such as finding percentages of amounts and using long division, including how to interpret remainders. Year 5 children will also revise the content taught this year which they have found difficult, such as area and perimeter; fractions, decimals and percentages; and negative number.

Year 6 children will learn how to add and subtract negative number as well as complete a range of investigations to deepen their understanding of number and calculation.

#### English

This half-term children will be studying the poem 'The Highwayman' by Alfred Noyes. They will begin by creating some pieces of drama to help them understand the story and empathise with the characters. Then they will write a newspaper report about the death of the Highwayman and Bess.

After this, they will debate which character is most to blame for Bess's death and we will hold a class debate. They will use this information to decide which character they think is most to blame and will write a persuasive letter to King George stating who they think should be held accountable.

Children will then research the history of highwaymen in Britain, including famous highwaymen, and will create a non-chronological report to present their findings.
